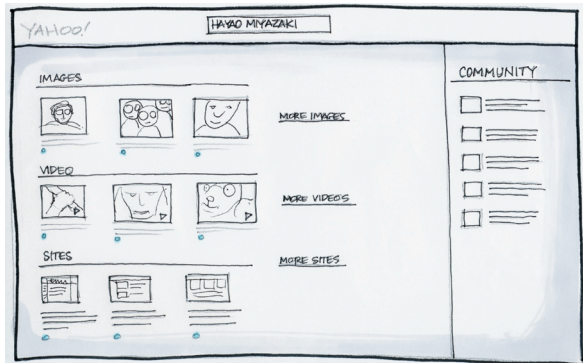
She nabs the great stuff into her project.

Meanwhile, Jacques is at home relaxing.

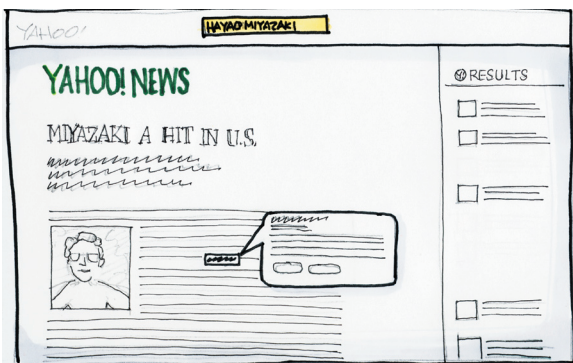
He does a search on Hayao Miyazaki because he wants to look up the name of a particular film. The search results return a variety of image, video and web results.

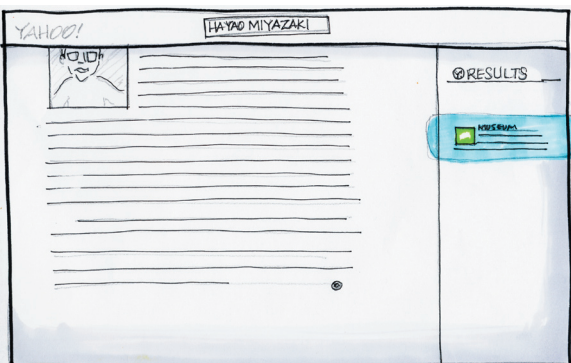

One particular result catches his eye and he clicks on it to read now.



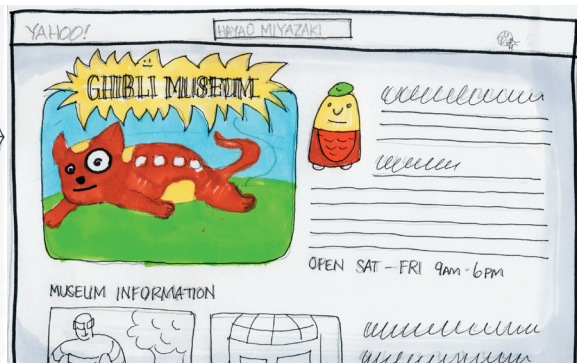

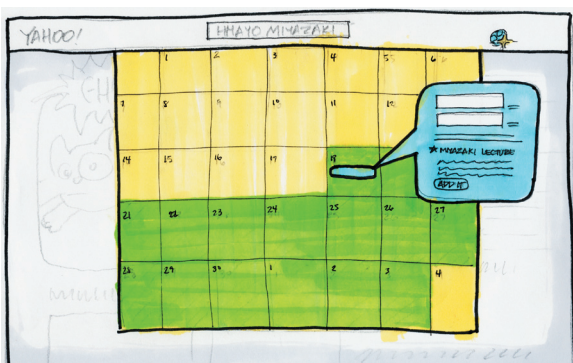

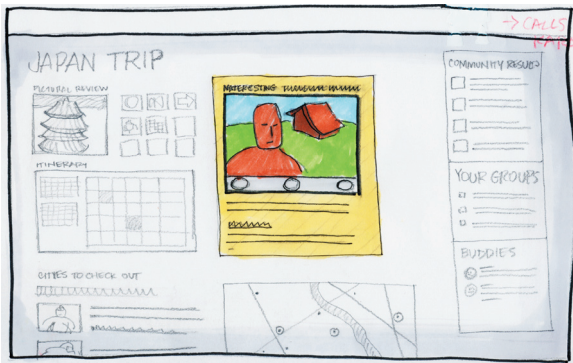
Excitedly, Jacques marks off the day on the itinerary and buys the tickets. He also includes a map of the area and the receipt amount and saves it all to the project.

Jacques does a video search and clips out a few choice samples of Miyazaki's work. "She's going to love this..." he thinks.



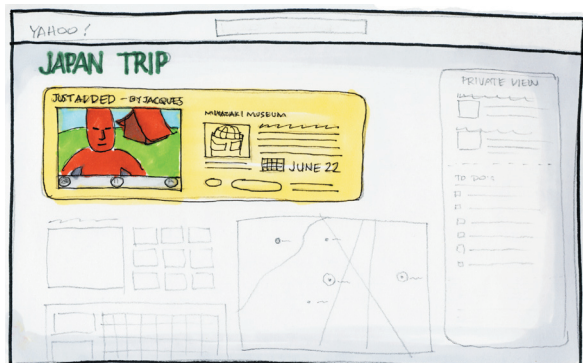
